## Blessed as a Gift Creation and Identity

Celebrate baptismal birthdays. Hold congregational celebrations of birthdays by month.

Mail or email a card to someone to remind him or her of his or her identity.

Affirm the identity of teens as they face cancel culture.

Celebrate differences God gives in gender, culture, and age.

Read stories about God's creation to young children.

Use a Lutherans for Life Bible study on identity. Share lifeaffirming resources on the gifts of gender, cultural heritage, and age.

Place a prayer board in a residence hall, school, or church and encourage individuals to post prayers.

Create tie blankets with an identity theme at an intergenerational gathering.

Send an encouraging text to a friend or family member who is struggling and remind him or her of Christ's love.

Provide transportation for those who can't drive.

Offer a period of respite for a caregiver.

Encourage adoption of children with disabilities.

Volunteer at camps or events designed for those with disabilities.

Host a cookout to get to know a new church family.

Connect with AbleLight and invite them to speak.

Rejoice in and recognize the gifts of those with disabilities.

Celebrate and support families who receive a fetal diagnosis of Down Syndrome.

Frequent establishments that provide jobs for those with disabilities.

Provide service and involvement opportunities for those with disabilities.

Support the vocation of mother and father.

Educate others on adoption as an alternative to abortion.

Throw a thank-you baby shower for a pregnancy care center client, thanking her for choosing life.

Share fetal model sets with expecting mothers and fathers as well as children.

Celebrate the month of a child's conception.

Offer to clean, cook meals, or provide rest to a new mother.

Advocate for paternity leave for both mothers and fathers.

Track a baby's growth in a classroom when a sibling is going to be born.

Provide meals and a gift to new mothers.

Throw a baby shower for a planned or unplanned pregnancy.

Hold a fundraiser or a diaper drive for a pregnancy care center.
