Donate or volunteer at a local domestic violence shelter.

Hold a Bible study on relationships that model Christ's love.

Recognize signs of abuse and create handouts to inform others.

Build strong relationships with people and be willing to ask questions.

Educate youth about abusive relationships and codependency.

Celebrate and support those who have left abusive relationships.

Pray for families and those newly dating, that they might grow in love and service toward each other.

Volunteer to be trained as a court advocate for victims of abuse.

Educate and celebrate healthy relationships.

Be persistent in maintaining friend relationships, even when couples distance themselves from others.

Blessed with Healing Responding to Human Trafficking

Celebrate all who have escaped trafficking.

Provide education on other kinds of trafficking in addition to sex trafficking, such as being enslaved to work.

Make a dedicated effort to use language that expresses the value of all life.

Invite those who have been trafficked or who work with a rescue organization to speak at your church.

Befriend the marginalized to aid in reducing the risk of being a victim of human trafficking.

Lead fundraising events to support human trafficking rescue organizations.

Know which places teach life skills and connect them with people in need.

Educate youth, those who are alone, and those who are visiting our country about the signs of trafficking.

Pray for those involved in trafficking.

Create a flier or brochure to post in bathrooms to make readers aware of human trafficking and where to get help.

Encourage connections to pastoral counseling or diaconal care for those who have been rescued.

Blessed with Healing Responding to Incest

Pray for children and for their healing.

Help those who have been abused to build healthy relationships.

Reassure abused children that shame and guilt is not theirs, that Christ took it from them on the cross.

> Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. - Isaiah 41:10



Consider participating in childcare training. Pray for those who desire to harm children.

Teach children who have been abused what God intends for mothers and fathers.

Provide pastoral and spiritual counseling for those who have a history of being sexually abused. Notice signs of possible sexual abuse in children's play and/or behavior.

Teach children and reinforce truths about safe touch and Godpleasing interactions. Know how to contact Child Protective Services.

Provide an educational pamphlet on signs of sexual abuse.

Volunteer to be a safe place for children to go when temporarily removed from families.

Volunteer to be a rape crisis advocate.

Affirm and uphold the value of life for rape survivors and children who were conceived in rape.

Recognize the need for personal space and request permission before touching people.

Provide education for safety in social situations to make people aware of risks and signs of rape.

Blessed with Healing Responding to Rape

Host a self-defense class.

Be aware of triggers and allow time for healing.

Learn about the risks and resources available for men as potential victims of rape.

Promote and utilize the blue light system on college campuses.

Post information about where to get help in bathrooms and on bulletin boards.

Volunteer to accompany others to a gathering or a safe location.

Attend counseling sessions with rape victims for support.

Have resources on your phone, such as emergency personnel, police, and security.
