

# Blessed for Serving CRT, Cultural Marxism, and Wokeness

Hold an educational awareness event on CRT and how to respond to it as a Christian.

Recognize all people are sinful and need Christ as Savior.

Seek confession and absolution for times you participated in persecution.

Remind others that identity is in Christ and not dependent on worldly views.

Look for ways to celebrate diversity in your church.

Look at the issue of race in the Bible and God's purposeful design for diversity.

Pray for healing from persecution, oppression, and separation of relationships.

Bring in a speaker to talk about how to start conversations that are life-affirming for all people.

Host an exchange student for the school year.

Affirm God's intent for marriage, family, and community.

Host the Bible study "Christians in a Woke World" available from Issues, Etc.

Talk about how to respond to the concepts of oppressed and oppressor from a Biblical perspective.

Partner with an inner-city church or a sister church in another city.

Avoid cultural stereotypes and get to know people as individuals.

Be an expert in what God says about every life.

Hold an event to identify cultural wokeness and how to reframe it with a Gospel-motivated voice.

Write letters to senators.

Provide childcare for single parents.

Donate to local pregnancy resource centers.

Volunteer at a local pregnancy resource center.

Pray that God would strengthen families.

Welcome and support single mothers at church and school.

Uphold the vocations of parent, child, and family.

Teach the benefits of abstinence and celibacy.

Pray for women who have had abortions and offer pastoral or diaconal counseling.

Speak to uphold mothers and fathers in addition to unborn children.

Compile a resource list to assist parents facing unexpected pregnancy.

Hold a prayer walk with stops that address various life issues connected to abortion.
