Cost?

- Conference & Meals (no housing) - \$100
- Conference, Meals, & Seminary dorm housing double occupancy - \$150

What's the theme all about?

There's a reason so many pro-life arguments get reduced to what sounds witty on a picket sign. Actual conversations are hard. So many of those signs shut them down before you ever even have to have a discussion. Those discussions are challenging. It isn't just "How do I talk about life with someone who doesn't already agree with me about it?" It's also navigating relationships that matter, the nuances of complex issues, and the traumas and sins and baggage that get brought to them by people who struggle with godly teaching that teaches a very black and white definition of right and wrong to a world very muddled by sin.

Being right isn't enough. We need to be helpful, too. Motivated by the gospel. Able not only to navigate these conversations in terms of right and wrong, as well as the facts that support these truths, but also the hope for sinners who find themselves on the wrong side, rooted in the God who loves them enough to bleed to forgive, die and rise to save the least of these, and even those who would harm them. Join us in the fall of '26 for apologetics training on life issues like abortion, end of life, gender, and other life issues at our young adult conference Defending Defending Life.

What will we be doing?

Gathering with dozens of other like-minded individuals, learning about why it actually matters that we know how to defend life. We'll worship, learn, serve, and spend time together as we join under the cross of Christ. Think Higher Things, over a weekend. We'll gather together to begin our weekend under the Word through Evening Prayer. You'll get a teaching session on Friday night with some hang out time with the group, too. Saturday is chalk full of four more worship services, three more teaching sessions, a service project, and more fellowship time. On Sunday morning, we'll finish our event by gathering with a local congregation for the Divine Service and Bible Study. Plan for the weekend to begin at 4:00 pm on Friday, and end by noon on Sunday.

What is included in the cost?

Included

- Housing (Double occupancy dorm style, as per usual!) for two nights and three days, including linens
- All event meals (Friday supper through Sunday breakfast)
- Four retreat sessions on why it matters that we know how to defend life
- Seven worship services throughout the weekend
- All event programming, which runs from morning to night during the event, including evening activities
